



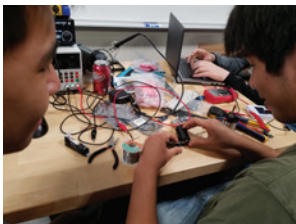
Build a Bike

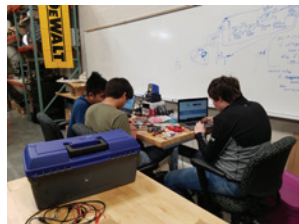
First Drone Class

HCC launched its first drone class last fall at the Stafford Campus. The course helps students prepare for drone certification.

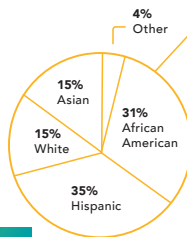
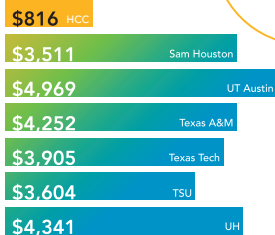


HCC Inventathon
